Milestone footbridge



Milestone footbridge is in the final stage of completion. Last week the contractors put up the flooring and rails. Currently contractors are doing back filling and final touch then the footbridge is ready for use. Already the community are excited of their gift.

Water Pump community to have foot bridge



Water pump community behind the Honiara botanical garden will soon have a footbridge. Currently the community members are transporting mix gravel and sand from Poha river to the site. At the present the community just crossing the stream but its very risky at night and during the rainy season when the stream will over flow and running.

White River school footpath



The White River school footpath is almost complete. Currently the contractors are working on minor finishing jobs. Already students and teachers are excited walking on the new footpath that connected the classrooms. One of students spoke to said it is now safer than before to walk freely from one classroom to the other.





This week CAUSE MID conducted the opening of bids for the road maintenance and rehabilitation of East Honiara roads. There are two contracts to be awarded; one for road maintenance at Kola ridge and the other for spot and drainage improvement at Abira both in East Honiara. Evaluation of bids is currently on and winners should be selected and notified next week.

The newly constructed footpath along the main street in Gizo has been completed. The footpath connected the Gizo market and the Gizo hospital. So far people in Gizo are excited to walk on the new footpath. It also makes life easier for people living in the Islands who usually come to Gizo to seek medical attention as they will walk easily to the hospital.







The construction of Munda Jetty and Market is progressing very well. Already mobilisation of materials are on sites and contractors are working on the first stages of these projects. The sign board is being erected in front of the entrance into the Munda market.
