The literacy training which Namoliki group enrolled in has create a big positive impact for the women in the community especially those women who involved in church programs.

Meanwhile Priscilla Maeniuta of LASI acknowledged CAUSE Project and World Bank for funding that enable the women to be who they are today and thanked trainer Mrs. Janice Mae for her hard work in teaching the adult learners.
