A contract has been signed recently with Capitol Construction for the restoration and maintenance of unsealed feeder road at lower Choviri, Mbokonavera 4 heights and upper Papaho. The road connects most communities in central Honiara and parts of Guadalcanal Province especially communities at Papao, Taba'a and even Mataniko.

Construction work will begin next week. The restoration and maintenance of the roads will definitely improve basic services and access for people in these areas.
