The 132 meter long ladder is the newest development in Gizo after the completion of the two ladders at District and Banana Valley. Resident's of top hill are waiting patiently for the completion so they can use it. Reports from Gizo office said that the new ladder will benefit more than 200 people living up the top

Work on the Noro market is about to complete. Contractors just recently completed the drainage system and now putting on stand pipes. Once these are completed the new market will be set to re-open in the coming months. Already the new re-development of the market is a facelift to Noro community.

Gizo town footpath



The footpath running from the old Western Provincial administration office to Gizo hospital is about to complete. The footpath is aim at improving pedestrians daily movement for Gizo community. It also aim at helping people who needs medical attention to walk comfortably to the hospital. Already people are using half of the completed section and are very happy walking on it as it more safer than before. The footpath is constructed by Savoto group.



After the suspension of all ISDT training couple of months ago Auki PIU has reopened its training. Today is the final and graduation day. Various participants from Kunu, Unasi, Ngalisagore, Kweinigeto and Ambu attended the 7 days training.

Kobito 2 footbridge



The 12 meters long foot bridge at Kobito 2 is about to complete. The footbridge was built following the community's need after observing a continuous challenge in crossing the stream. During the rainy season the stream will rise and the water will flow and run into various nearby houses. Often people living on the other side of the community find it hard to go across on the other side during bad weather. With the foot bridge now about to complete life will be much easier for the community.



Children of Fulisango can now be able to walk freely after the completion of their new footpath. The footpath runs down from 777 bus stop and connect with the old footpath near the SSEC church. Most women spoken to talked high of the project intervention in their community.

Juniper School footpath



Juniper school footpath is progressing very well. The footpath should be complete in the coming days. Once complete it will help the school children daily movement in the campus.
