Munda Market update



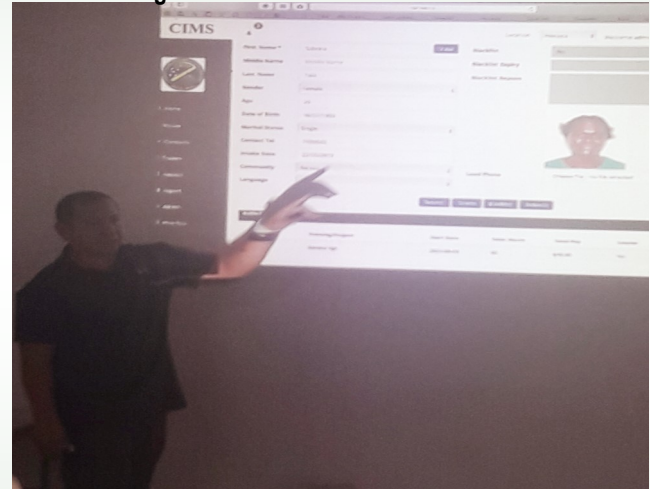
