Muriel said for the many years Ngalisagore community was established life is meaningless in terms of the accessibility of services in Auki. The community is using a log for crossing until the very day a miracle finally landed and change their access to more relax environment. Muriel said it is a miracle indeed, life is now in fullness for both women, children and men old and young, disable or in a special needs they are enjoying walking on a more comfortable bridge to access main road and services in Auki easily. Meanwhile Joe Ruriti of Auki PIU said the successful completion of the footbridge is a collaborative effort between CAUSE team and the surrounding community. Some of them are not trained but they give hand and support one way or the other as they believe the footbridge will benefit all of them. Many people in Auki who passed by also commented positively on the improved access for the community.
