CAUSE clarifies information on quarantine centres in Choiseul and Shortlands

CAUSE Project clarified the information carried in the Island Sun newspaper quoting that Community Access and Urban Services Project (CAUSE) been awarded contracts to fast track the readiness of quarantine centres for border communities in Western Province and Choiseul, which is not true.

The memorandum of understanding that CAUSE has with Ministry of Finance and Treasury, Ministry of Infrastructure Development and Honiara City Council are for emergency works that only covers Noro Lodge and Nusatupe quarantine centres in Western Province.

There was a request for similar assistance in Choiseul and Shortlands however, these were not approved by the World Bank as these areas fall

Street cleaning



Cleaning services in the Honiara city is continuous and local community groups normally get up early in the morning to do their first set of hours and another four hours in the late evening. These community groups really did their best to keep Honiara clean, however, it will take time for general public to realise and work together to keep the city clean.

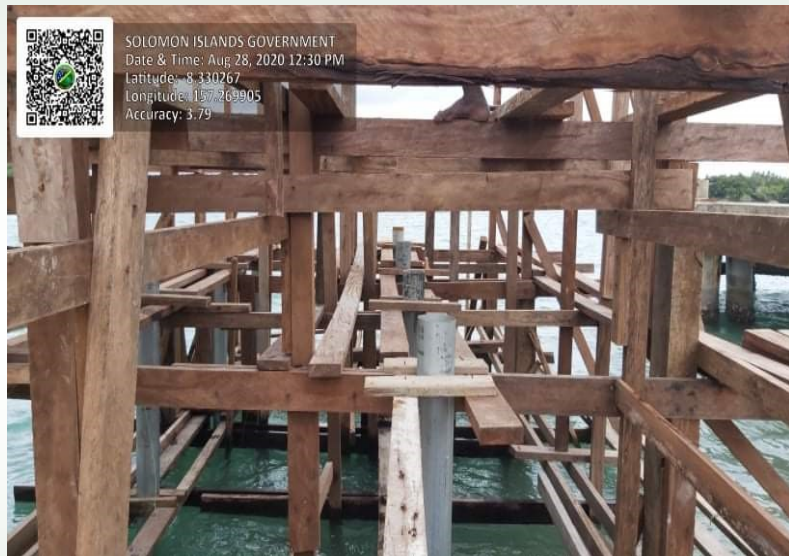
1. Its raining season so staff are advice to take extra care when out in the project sites

Construction of Gizo guard house



Work on the construction of security guard house at Nusatupe quarantine site is progressing at the moment. Currently the local workers are transporting timber from Gizo to Nusatupe Island as construction work continuous.

Munda Jetty



The piling of Munda jetty post is in the final stage. Soon the local workers will remove the scapple and will commence work on the main structures of the jetty. The jetty is seven meters long and will accommodate good number of boats from the nearby Islands who usually comes to Munda to access basic services.
