Fulikaomae Jacob's Ladder, Auki, Malaita Province





Fulikaomae community in Auki of Malaita Province is the latest excited community after the completion of their Jacob's ladder. Fulikaomae has a population of more than 500 people. People living up the hill find it hard to come down to town especially during bad weather but with the new Jacob's ladder life is more meaningful to them especially in going to Auki town to access services such as bank, schools, market and hospital.

Gizo street footpath, Western Province





Work on the completion of the Gizo street footpath is on the final stage. The footpath runs from the old provincial administration office towards the hospital area. Penny Siliako Gizo Office Community Liaison Officer said currently pedestrians are enjoying walking on the new footpath. Penny said most people he spoke to talked high of the new footpath as it helps them accessing the hospital easily compared to the past. The footpath is 3000km long and was constructed by Savoto Community of Gizo. Western Provincial government acknowledged the ongoing support rendered by CAUSE Project to the province.

Big Baru footpath, Noro, Western Province



The new footpath at big Baru of Noro has been completed. The 200 meter long footpath is serving more than 500 people residing along the Baru street. One of the resident Mr. Suresh Dhari said the footpath is already helping the community. Many times when there is rain people find it difficult to walk on the soft ground as its too slippery. With the new footpath it has improved the lives of people who are living in that area mostly school children and mothers who uses the road every day.

Kaibia footpath, Central Honiara

People living at Kaibia next to the Central Bank area are the latest happiest people smiling away after the completion of their 160 meters long footpath. The foot path is a blessing to the community. One of the community member spoken to said so far people are enjoying using the footpath which make their lives easier especially going back home after work in the evenings when they already tired and carrying heavy loads.
