58 graduate from Verava Literacy School

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Fifty –Eight students of Verava literacy school last week graduated with certificates of completion at Kongulai village of West Guadalcanal. Literacy Association Solomon Islands (LASI) implemented the program funded under CAUSE Project of World Bank. The students received their certificates after six weeks of learning. Team leader of Infrastructure Delivery Training (ISDT) Judith Fangalasu'u during the historic celebration explained that when she first asked where on Guadalcanal needed to be reached with literacy Verava community was identified. LASI Coordinator Mrs. Precilla Maeniuta on behalf of their team thanked CAUSE Project for the opportunity given.
