Work on the Town End school footpath project in Auki is entering final scope of completion. Currently local workers are working on completing concrete slabbing. Already the school children and teachers are smiling as they walked comfortably on a smooth footpath along their school. Full completion of the project will be in the coming weeks.

Auki clinic abluion block and entrance is progressing very well. At present local workers are tiding up the remaining jobs that needs to be done especially welding the gate and cleaning up. Finishing jobs will be early next week and project should be full completed.



Full completion of tiling in the Nusatupe quarantine centre building will be next week. Currently local workers are working hard to catch up with the timeline.



The Nusatupe jetty is in the final stage of completion this afternoon. So far 95% of the job is completed.
