News/ Announcements.

1. The Ministry of Health and Medical Services (MHMS) as the government ministry leading COVID-19 response, acknowledge concerns raised by the Opposition Office regarding dire situation in India and the government's plans to acquire bulk of AstraZeneca vaccines from India

2. The Solomon Islands Government had requested 600,000 doses of AstraZeneca vaccines from India, the world's largest supplier of AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine.

3. Leader of Opposition, Hon. Matthew Wale, is concerned about the actions alleged to have been taken by the shipping agent of MV Chefoo recently, which was in direct breach of the Standard Operating Procedures governing the clearance of foreign ships.
