News/ Announcements.

1. Central Islands Province (CIP) has launched their COVID-19 vaccination program at the provincial capital, Tulagi, with Premier Hon Stanley Manetiva the first to receive the jab.
2. The Solomon Islands Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SICCI) and the Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) recognizes that there is a definite link between the rule of law in a nation and growth in investment which underpins private sector development and job creation. This was reiterated on Thursday 19 August 2021 during the re-signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between SICCI and the RSIPF after a review on the MoU was conducted.
3. The Guadalcanal provincial government is now in the process to claim the Matanikau industrial area in Central Honiara. Premier Francis Sade told Solomon Times Online an offer letter was granted to the Provincial Government last year.
4. Hundreds of hopeful applicants are in Honiara in the recent weeks going through interviews, paying fees for medical clearance and putting together other required documents for the seasonal work scheme in Australia.
