News/ Announcements.

1. Solomon Islands has backed China yet again, rejecting statements made by the UN's High Commissioner for Human Rights, Michelle Bachelet, on Beijing's handling of protests in Hong Kong and its treatment of the ethnic Uighur population in Xinjiang province.
2. Solomon Islands and Japan have reaffirmed their bilateral cooperation during a virtual meeting between Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare and his Japanese counterpart Prime Minister Suga Yoshihide early this month.
3. Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare is pleading to those eighteen years and above to get vaccinated and protect those that cannot get vaccinated. He says the government is targeting to vaccinate 415,500 people – this is based on the recent census for those people eighteen years and above.
4. The Ministry of Health and Medical services (MHMS) has established new sites for those eligible for the COVID-19 vaccination. The new sites are on Guadalcanal, Western and Choiseul provinces. New mobile sites have also been set up in Honiara.
