CAUSE Project yesterday handed over a newly completed footbridge at Mata Valley of West Kolaridge in Central Honiara. Mata Valley is a vulnerable community facing hardship in accessing services in Honiara town. Often, they have to walk many miles away to be able to get a transport to town as there was a creek that separating them with the other ridge. The project took six months to be completed and was constructed mainly by women and few men of the community who were trained by CAUSE Project. The 12 meters footbridge is made of concrete, steel and timber decking.

CAUSE Project has renovated Aligegeo school ablution block and built footpath around it. It also rehabilitate two water wells for the girls to use. Renovation of the ablution block is also part of the COVID preparation as Aligegeo has also identified as one isolation sites.

Vara creek Jaco's ladder progressing well





News/ Announcements.

- 1. Good news for rural families, 160 workers are bound for Australia yesterday to work in Queensland under the Seasonal Work Program (SWP) and the Pacific Labour Scheme (PLS).
- 2. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) says common human coronaviruses, including types 229E, NL63, OC43, and HKU1, usually cause mild to moderate upper-respiratory tract illnesses, like the common cold.
- 3. Reopening of the Solomon Islands borders will now become an agenda item for the Oversight Committee. Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare in his weekly statement said he had directed the Oversight Committee to seriously start thinking about a target date and time to reopen the borders.
- 4. The government is urging families to vaccinate their babies against illnesses such as whooping cough or pertussis. With the report of an outbreak of pertussis, Dr. Yogesh Choudary from the Ministry of Health and Medical Services (MHMS) says it is important that families bring their babies for their usual check-ups.
