Noro fish market progressing



Work on the Noro fish market is progressing well. Already half of the area has been slabbed. Over the coming weeks they will continue on slabbing other parts. It is expected to complete before the end of this month.

#### BP footbridge foundation started.



Work is going on well on the BP footbridge in Gizo. The photo showing the GI piles driven to elevation to anchor the reinforced concrete abutment. Abutment installation is expected to start in the coming week to give way to the placement of channel girders for bridge and decking.

- 1. The deadline for the first jab of the mandatory COVID-19 vaccination has lapsed. The government had stated earlier that those government workers that have not taken their first jab by the 31st of August 2021 will not be allowed into their place of work.
- 2. The Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) says 32 people were arrested before the lockdown exercise closed at 6am, 31st August 2021.
- 3. The Ministry of Health and Medical Services (MHMS) says it is deeply and utterly disappointed at several incidents of rock throwing at NRH vehicles and workers including illegal roadblocks in Honiara during the lockdown period.
- 4. The Solomon Islands Chamber of Commerce and Industry (SICCI) has launched a campaign with the aim to get private sector support to encourage and drive vaccination as Solomon Islands continues its fight against COVID-19.
- 5. Solomon Islands top striker Raphael Lea'i has suffered an injury during a friendly match with Italy. Italy by 3 goals.
