A new climate resilience road improvement at Mbokanavera 1 in Central Honiara is progressing well. This week the workers completed the first lane. Next week they will work on the second lane.

## Mataniko Pikinini Clinic



Work on Mataniko Pikinini clinic at China town is progressing well. A site visit yesterday seen the workers working hard on back filling and digging up the trenches ahead of next week pouring of concrete.



## Auki Primary school drainage improvement



The drainage improvement at Auki Primary school is into the final stage. This week the workers work on footing of the basement of the culvert and concrete pouring. Next week they will complete the concrete work and bury the culvert surface.

## COVID 19 - Hand Wash Station



More than twenty hand wash stations had been completed. The completed hand wash stations will then be donated to various schools and clinics in Honiara. As soon as the stickers are placed on them the stations will be seen in those places. There are more than 100 wash stations still under fabrication stages. The hand-wash stations will be distributed to schools and clinics that have running water at their disposals.

## Munda Seawall



Munda seawall is slowly shaping up although there is a big challenge working against nature especially the water. Workers are determined and continuing with their job. Depending on the tides the project is expected to complete before Christmas.

## Disability awareness for CAUSE staff
