## New Jetty for Noro CBD

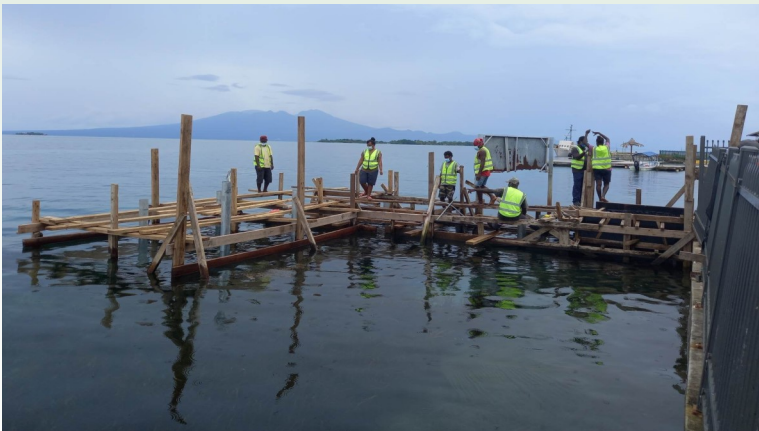

A site preparation is under way in Noro CBD to pave the way for the construction of a new jetty. The new jetty will be built on the current spot islanders used to park their boats. The current spot is not conducive for incoming and outgoing passengers since there is a soil erosion taking place. With the new jetty it will boost economic development activities especially for those living in the Islands who usually come to Noro to access services.

The two jetties at the Gizo market are progressing well. Currently the workers are working on assembling the bearers. In the coming week they will on flooring and railings.

## Second lane of concrete road at Mbokanavera 1



The road rehabilitation and improvement to climate resilience at Mbonavera 1 in Central Honiara is progressing well. Currently workers are working on the second lane after coming the second lane at Mbonavera 5.

## North Tanuli road



Work will soon start on the rehabilitation of the steep section of the north Tanuli road in the Kukum area. The steep section will be concreted to a climate resilience road as most of the time public facing hardship in going up the steep section as it always rough.

## Mataniko clinic



The Mataniko pikinini clinic extension has been covered with roofing as of this week. Currently workers are working on the fencing, benches and paintings. By next week all outstanding jobs should be completed and clinic should be open back for public.

## News/ Announcements.

1. Solomon Islands has recorded 258 new COVID-19 cases over the past 48 hours. The cumulative total COVID-19 cases for the country since the outbreak now stands at 9,758.
2. The Solomon Islands Government, and the United Nations (UN) jointly hosted the first Joint Steering Committee meeting to discuss the implementation of their joint work in the Solomon Islands, strategic partnerships moving forward, and financing opportunities on Wednesday 16 March.
3. Solomon Islands national team this morning won its first game against Cook Islands by 2 goals to nil.
4. The National Hosting Authority (NHA) has extended its arm to support the capacity building of the National Sports Council (NSC) as the main body established by the Solomon Islands Government purposely to support the development of sports in the country.
