Fighter 1 Road Rehabilitation Commenced



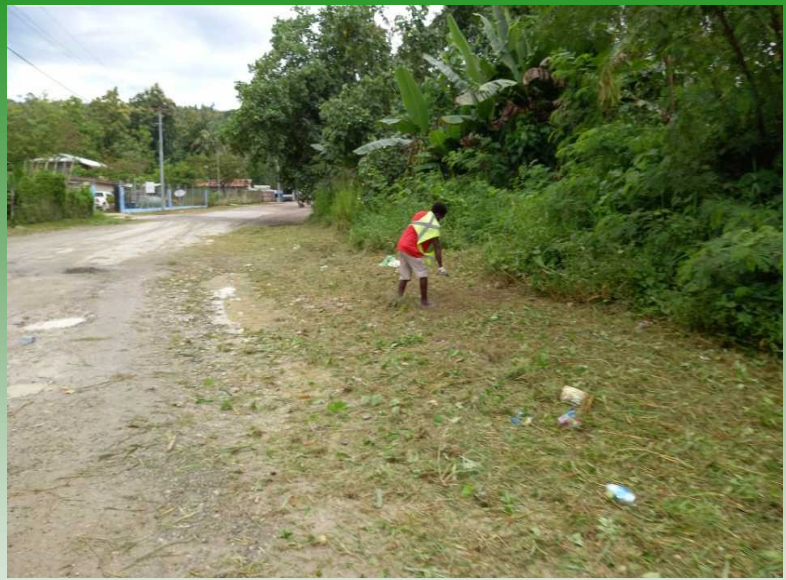
