1. Honiara PMU ISDT trainings has been temporarily suspended until further notice. This is due to some staff who were tested positive with corona virus.
2. The Government will provide a 50 percent duty exemption on fuel imports and will remove sales tax on fuel across the board for 6 months effective from 1st June, 2022.
