Cleaning Service in Auki




Auki town always cleaned and tidy thanks to the WCC workers who are working around the clock to keep Auki town clean and tidy.

- The country has recorded 149 new COVID-19 cases over the past 48 hours. Health Minister Dr Culwick Togamana gave the update during his COVID-19 situation update on the national broadcaster, SIBC. The country now has a cumulative total case count of 12,005.
- After 2 years of recession caused by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic, the Pacific is expected to return to positive growth this year, according to the Asian Development Outlook (ADO) 2022, ADB's flagship economic publication, which was released yesterday.
