- 1. Australia remained the health partner of choice for Solomon Islands and that Australia would continue to provide support to the health sector, including through Australia's recent AUD \$1million commitment to upgrade the National referral Hospital's Acute Care Ward.
- 2. A total of six candidates have been nominated for the West Kwaio by-election after the closure of the 7 days nomination period yesterday. The candidates include a female and five males.

Following the third and fourth play-off at the OFC Women's Nations Cup 2022, there's plenty more to celebrate for the Solomon Islands and Samoa who were included in the biggest movements made in the latest FIFA/Coca-Cola Women's World rankings. The Solomon Islands leaped 15 spots to 105 ranking them sixth from ninth in the Oceania region, after finishing third at the Women's Nations Cup in Fiji.
