In the past people going in and out of the building so its not safe. Now that the fence is erected market vendors are more comfortable to be in that building.

Rhoda said she cant go to school because she finds it hard to use her wheelchair on the muddy road. This year she enrol back after she learnt of the new footpath that enables her to access school easily.

Literacy Training in Lilisiana, Auki

A female teacher at St Paul's Kindy in Auki yesterday came out to thanked the project for the provision of footpath for the school children. She said in the past the children are not safe walking around the school as the area was muddy. With the footpath children are more comfortable in playing around the area.



A literacy training is currently going on at Lilisiana of Auki. The trainings has offered a lot of insights for those illiterate women in the village. One woman spoke to said she can now read and understand things better than before.

- 1. The World Bank's Board of Directors have approved a new World Bank project that will work to improve regional collaboration, national capacity and management, and the sustainable longer-term development of Solomon Islands' vital fisheries sector.
- 2. National carrier plans for new schedule effective from August Solomon Airlines has confirmed the airline's twice-weekly flights between Brisbane and Honiara will be maintained as the national carrier awaits further easing of travel restrictions to plan a broader international schedule.
- 3. Australian Foreign Minister Penny Wong will arrive in Solomon Islands today for discussions with Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare and senior members of his cabinet.
- 4. Tourism Solomons has welcomed the resumption of Fiji Airways flight between the Solomon Islands and Fiji from 02 July 2022, seeing the move as a major step towards the country re-joining the world after more than two-years border closure.
