1. As of today, 1st July 2022, visitors to Solomon Islands will no longer be required to undergo institutional or home quarantine. The country's international borders has open today, with the first fully booked international commercial flight from Brisbane scheduled to arrive in the country this afternoon.
2. The Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Unit has graduated 12 officers after completing level 2 of the International Mine Action Standard (IMAS) course requirements as specialist operators at the EOD facility, East of Honiara.
3. Solomon Islands and India have renewed and reaffirmed their commitment to enhance bilateral cooperation to new heights. This was made following a meeting between the Minister of Foreign Affairs and External Trade, Hon. Jeremiah Manele and his Indian counterpart, the Minister of External Affairs, Dr S Jaishankar at the margins of the 2022 Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) in Kigali, Rwanda recently.
4. Australia's Prime Minister Anthony Albanese says he and Solomon Islands counterpart Manasseh Sogavare have broken ground with a "constructive discussion".
