- 1. As Solomon Islands opens up to the world, and in so doing dropping all mandatory quarantine requirements on arrival, variants of the highly contagious Omicron are infecting the populations of neighbouring Fiji and Australia.
- 2. The National Referral Hospital (NRH) have now stocked up on medication and inhaler devices that were initially in low supply
- 3. Weightlifter Jenly Tegu Wini heads the Solomon Islands' 19-strong team for the Commonwealth Games team in Birmingham. The athletes will compete in aquatics, athletics, beach volleyball, boxing, judo, table tennis, triathlon and weightlifting.
