Workers are currently mobilising for the fencing of MSG building in Gizo. The fencing is necessary following the need to secure market vendor's produce and store things at that building.


## News/ Announcements.

- 1. World Bank Increases its COVID-19 Assistance to Solomon Islands by additional US\$8 million to provide immediate support to COVID-19 emergency response, vaccine access and health system strengthening.
- 2. The UN Capital Development Fund (UNCDF) is embarking on a joint historic project with Our Telekom to launch mobile money services in Solomon Islands in efforts to boost financial inclusion and transform the digital payments ecosystem in the country.
- 3. Over the past 96 hours starting from April 29th 2022 to May 2nd 2022 the country has recorded an additional 560 new cases of COVID-19. The cumulative total for the country now stands at 16,441.
- 4. In Papua New Guinea, the COVID-19 outbreak has spread rapidly to all 22 provinces, affecting many people. Data from the World Health Organization (WHO) reveal that, as of mid-April 2022, more than 43,600 cases have been confirmed, with 649 deaths. The true burden is likely to be much higher as many cases will have gone unreported.
