- 1. A handover of good number of projects in Auki will be on 8th September 2022. Honiara team comprise of AusAID, World Bank and CAUSE officers will be attending the event.
- A courtesy meeting yesterday morning between Capt. Henry Kim, commander of the Pacific Partnership Mission to the Solomon Islands, and Mrs. Pauline McNeil, Health Permanent Secretary highlighted the need for continued partnership and collaboration for better health care service for Solomon Islanders.
- 3. Tina Hydro Project Bore hole drilling for the Community Benefit Sharing Project (CBSP) water systems are now complete, with a further 3 water bores holes at Belaha near completion. A total of 18 holes have been drilled ready for the system construction which will benefit approximately 40 communities from Bahomea, Malatoha, Mataruka and Belaha.
