Concrete Road at Gilbert Camp to complete Soon



The improvement to climate resilience critical section of Gilbert Camp to April ridge road in East Honiara has reached 70% of job done. The contractor is working hard to complete the improvement with the given time frame. By the end of this month rehabilitation should be completed including the drainage systems.

Work on Unafi Sigetai footpath in Auki is progressing well. Workers have completed concreting the first section and has move on to the next section. Work is ongoing until the footpath is completed before end of this month.

- 1. Solomon Islands Prime Minister Manasseh Sogavare has used the opening of a meeting with Anthony Albanese to once again reassure Australia over his government's security pact with China, declaring he will never allow a foreign military base to be set up in his country .
- 2. Officers of the Royal Solomon Islands Police Force (RSIPF) and Australian Federal Police (AFP), who are part of the Solomons' International Assistance Force (SIAF), recently visited the new international terminal at Honiara International Airport. The new terminal, which is nearing completion, is situated on the Western end of the current international terminal. The facility is part of the country's preparations for the Pacific Games in 2023. Kitano Construction Company employees on the site led RSIPF and AFP officers for the tour around the facility.
- 3. A new Permanent Secretary for the Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock (NMAL) was sworn-in by the Governor General Sir David Vunagi at Government House this week. He is Mr. Lottie Vaisekavea from Nukukaisi village, Central Makira, Makira Ulawa Province.
