- ISDT training in Honiara PMO will conclude next week Tuesday for this financial year. Training will resume January 2023 1.
- 2. An outbreak of COVID-19 has been declared for Temotu Province with over 400 plus cases reported in the past nine days from Lata, Tikopia and Dendu. In response the Ministry of Health and Medical Services (MHMS) has, over the weekend, deployed a team of medical and public health workers to the province.
