1. The United States of America has officially opened its embassy in the Solomon Islands.
2. Australia Funding Helps Prepare Games Village and Athletes Accommodation. A core part of this funding (SBD54 million) has been allocated for the refurbishment of seven (7) schools and institution's dormitories and classrooms in Honiara which will serve as athlete accommodation during the Pacific Games.
3. The Solomon Islands wonderkid Raphael Lea'i has now become the country's first international professional football player signed by a European club.
